

WATER RESTRICTIONS UPDATE



Stage 4 Water Restrictions "Time of Use" has been implemented; **water supply will be interrupted from 9pm at night to 5am the next morning.** Should this measure not meet the required curtailment, additional shutdowns of the water supply during the day, may be required. Consumers may also experience lower pressure and interruptions to supply without notice, in our effort to achieve the curtailments needed, to ensure we prolong the storage of the Hazelmere Dam.

STAGE 4 - TIME OF USE

Final Effluent Water (Recycled Water) is available at our Waste Water Treatment Works. The water can be used for topping up pools, watering gardens and washing of vehicles, but not for drinking or cooking. 5000 Litres of this water can be delivered to customers around Sembcorp Siza Water's concession area at a cost of R850 (ex. Vat).

1. The use of hosepipes are totally banned. Please ENSURE they are disconnected and stored away.
2. No washing of buildings or structures other than for immediate fire control or protection.
3. No use of potable water for dust control.
4. Known water leaks to be repaired within 24 hours. Dripping taps and toilets to be urgently repaired by consumers.
5. Golf courses are no longer allowed to use potable water to irrigate.
6. Irrigation systems utilising the potable water system are to be turned off.
7. Washing of vehicles, bicycles, motorbikes, trucks, boats, trailers and small planes are only allowed through the use of buckets.
8. Garbage trucks and vehicles carrying perishables and food are exempted from these restrictions. Written permission to be applied for if other exemptions are necessary due to health, safety or welfare requirements.
9. Fountains and water features to be disconnected from potable water supply.
10. No new swimming pools are to be constructed. Pools to be filled with recycled water only.
11. The use of Jacuzzi's are strictly banned.
12. Pressure management may be introduced to curb consumption and hence lower water pressure may be experienced.
13. Water supply may be interrupted in order to reduce consumption during the day. Businesses are urged to make appropriate arrangements for their sustainability.



Those that do not adhere to the restrictions will be liable for **a minimum fine of R3000.**
